INTRODUCTION

Dear MHSa Members and Friends,

For runaways, those who have been kicked out of their family homes, and youth coming from state systems of care, finding a job and a place to live is a formidable task, especially without many of the life skills and resources that most of us take for granted. With few alternatives, many young adults turn to living on the streets or in homeless shelters, where they typically find more dead ends than fresh starts. As we at the Massachusetts Housing and Shelter Alliance (MHSa) work to achieve our mission of ending homelessness in the Commonwealth, we recognize that preventing and ending homelessness among young adults are critical components of our work.

It is important to point out that homelessness, especially among young adults, is a symptom of tough times; it is not an identity and should never be regarded as a permanent way of life. By its very nature, young adulthood is a time of transition. These days, most young people are not expected to live independently when they turn 18 – nor should they be. For most young adults, the transition into adulthood is supported by family or community resources. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, 77 percent of people ages 18 to 24 live with parents or other relatives or in college dormitories.

To ease the difficult transition to adulthood, it is imperative that communities provide targeted housing as well as educational and employment opportunities to young people. We at MHSa hope that this updated Young Adult Resource Guide will help youth access the many community supports already in place. The programs and resources included in this guide address many of the issues that at-risk youth confront.

MHSa continues to advocate for more housing for young adults who are homeless or at risk for homelessness. We also encourage directors of “mainstream” youth programs to make them more accessible to some of the most vulnerable young adults who are living on the streets or in shelters.

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Please note: The vast majority of services listed in this Resource Guide are offered at no cost. Occasionally, there is a nominal fee associated with training programs and educational resources. If English is not a client's first language, the organizations listed here often have staff members who speak Spanish and other languages. In this Guide, the population known as *young adults* is generally defined as youth between the ages of 18 and 24. However, many of the services offered in these pages also are available to adolescents between the ages of 12 and 17.

It also provides a safe and supportive environment where young adults may address basic needs for hygiene, nutrition, and clothing; access case management; obtain treatment for health, mental health, and substance abuse problems; and get advice for legal issues that preclude their obtaining housing or employment.

Bridge offers a safe environment for 14- to 16-year-olds who need food (breakfast and lunch), a place to shower and do laundry, and someone to talk to. Bridge's outreach workers make contact with street-involved youth and offer them referrals to medical and dental care and transitional housing. Every weekday, the Bridge Mobile/Medical Van makes stops in various Boston neighborhoods to provide youth with basic medical care and referrals. Office hours are 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Boston Youth Network is a free after-school program for at-risk youth ages 12 to 21 in East Boston. The Network offers the skills youth need to succeed academically and in life. Eighty percent of participants are low-income youth of color, who are largely newly-immigrated Latinos. The Boston Youth Network is also a resource for providers serving youth at high risk in Boston. Youth at high risk may be court-involved, truant, chronic substance abusers, homeless, pregnant, or parenting. They also may be struggling in school or dropping out, having difficulty with parents, or suffering from the trauma of violence. An excellent user-friendly resource is the *Boston Youth Survival Guide*, available free online. This 29-page guide is available to help youth in Boston find the services they need to be safe, healthy, and successful.

Rosie's also offers guests an opportunity to participate in the Women's Craft Cooperative (WCC), where women are introduced to craft skills, such as jewelry-making, and the basics of merchandising. Guests can then sell their products to the public. Staff members represent English, Spanish, and Haitian-Creole speakers.

On the Rise runs a wellness program that focuses on creative activities such as writing or art projects. There is no clean and sober policy. First-time visitors should call the office ahead or stop by between 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Homeless young adults generally appreciate the student-run program at UniLu, which is open from 7 p.m. to 8 a.m. on the evening of November 15 to the morning of April 15. Call at 7:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m. to enter the lottery for the 14-night beds. To find out whether his/her lottery number was picked, a young adult must call back between 8:05 and 8:30 a.m. or between 7:00 and 9:00 p.m. Check in by 9:00 p.m., or arrive by 11:00 p.m. if you have notified the shelter of a work-related delay. Call at 9:30 p.m. to check for any leftover beds for a single night. Work contracts with the shelter are available as part of a transitional housing program. UniLu offers meals to guests as well as the use of laundry facilities and computers with Internet connection. Blankets and food are available at the door for non-guests.

Young adults who turn 18 while in the custody of DCF are eligible to sign a Voluntary Placement Agreement up to age 22, if placement remains necessary and they choose to follow a DCF service plan and attend school or vocational training. Young adults who will receive a bachelor's degree during their 22nd year may continue with placement services until age 23 with the approval of the Area Director.

If individuals choose *not* to continue placement or services with the Department, then the DCF case closes. These individuals retain their MassHealth coverage until age 21 and may reapply for DCF services at any time before their 22nd birthday. Young adults who want to reapply to DCF for voluntary services should do so at the DCF area office closest to their current address.
