Specialized substance use treatment services are available for first responders in our LEADER (Law Enforcement, Active Duty, Emergency Responder) program, which provides mental health and addiction services designed specifically for men and women in uniform. LEADER's experienced team of physicians, psychologists, social workers, nurses, and counselors has specialized expertise in working with police officers, military staff, and first responders.
